The best moments happen after a class slam or even the gradewide slam, when another teacher will come up to me and say, 'I'll never look at this kid in the same way.' The pieces these kids write are so revealing. It checks us on our biases and assumptions about the kids in front of us. It allows us teachers to see them for who they really are. 
